NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

March 31, 2007

1. DESCRIPTION OF THE ORGANIZATION

Atlas Service Corps, Inc. (the Organization) is a Delaware nonprofit organization incorporated on April 7, 2006 with the primary mission to integrate a global citizen sector in order to create a global partnership for development. The Organization facilitates international fellowships for rising citizen sector leaders who participate in a management development program in the U.S. while volunteering at a U.S. nonprofit organization. These Fellows then commit to work an additional year in the citizen sector of their home country, sharing new skills, best practices, and valuable experience.

2. <u>SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES</u>

Basis of accounting

The financial statements of the Organization have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting. Accordingly, revenues are recognized when earned and expenses when incurred.

Cash and equivalents

The Organization recognizes all highly liquid investments purchased with an original maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents.

Investments

Investments are recorded at market value. Realized and unrealized gains and losses on investments are reported on the statement of activities as they occur.

Pledges Receivable

Pledges receivable represents amounts which have been promised but not yet received. Pledges beyond one year are discounted to reflect the present value of the pledge.

Deferred Revenue

The Organization records income for program services revenue which has been paid in advance as deferred revenue.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES - CONTINUED

Fixed assets

Furniture and equipment are reported at cost. Depreciation on all property and equipment is computed using the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the assets, which is five years. Depreciation expense for the nine months, ended March 31, 2007 was \$125.

Estimates

Preparation of the financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Donated Services and Materials

Contributions of services are recognized if the services received create or enhance nonfinancial assets or require specialized skills, and are provided by individuals possessing those skills and would typically need to be purchased if not provided by donation. Contributed services and promises to give services that do not meet the above criteria are not recognized. During the nine months ended March 31, 2006, the Organization received \$48,650.

Income taxes

The Organization is a nonprofit organization exempt from federal income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The Organization is subject to income taxes for unrelated business income activities. During the nine months ended March 31, 2007, the Organization did not have any unrelated business income subject to federal or state income tax.

Net Assets

Net assets consist of the following categories:

Unrestricted Funds

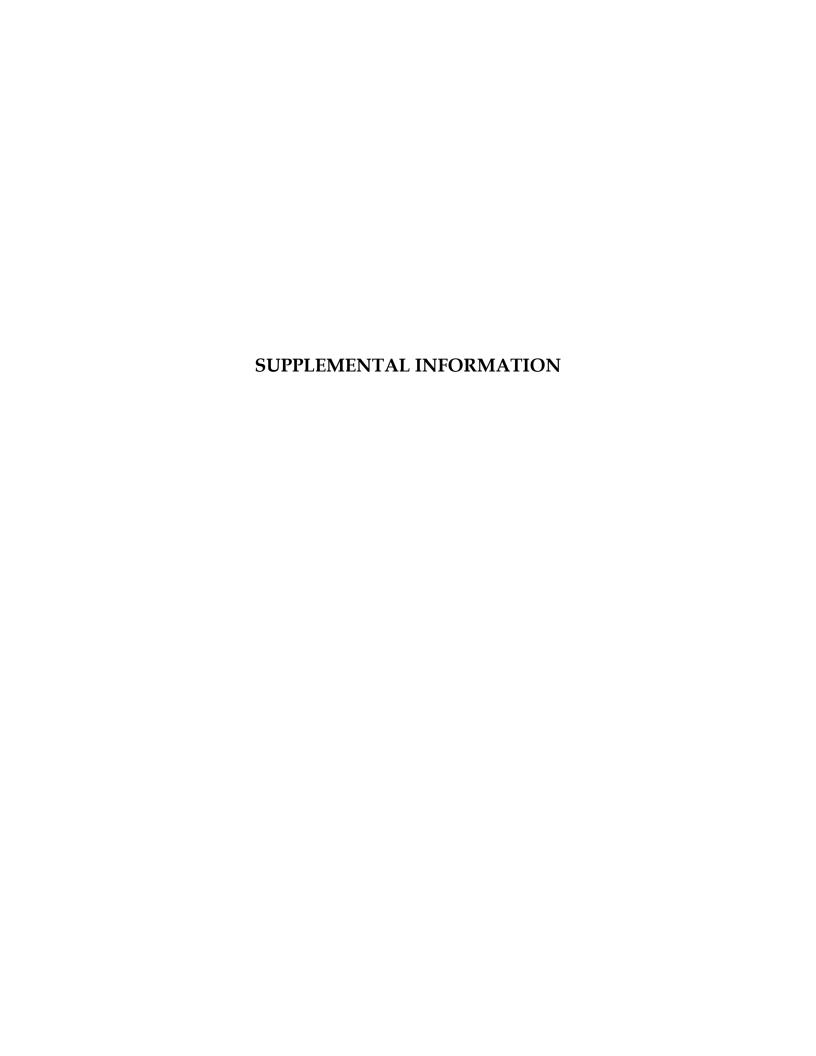
Unrestricted net assets represent resources over which the Board of Directors has discretionary control and are used to carry out operations of the Organization in accordance with its bylaws. The Organization has elected to report contributions which are released from restriction in the year received as unrestricted contributions.

Temporarily Restricted Funds

Temporarily restricted net assets represent contributions which have been restricted by donors for specific programs or activities. Restrictions which have been met by the passage of time or expenditure of net assets are reported as revenues released from restrictions on the statement of activities. For the nine months ended March 31, 2007, the Organization received \$95,000 in temporarily restricted contributions.

3. PROGRAM SERVICE REVENUE

As described previously in note 1, the Organization facilitates a management development program. As of March 31, 2007, the Organization has negotiated seven executed contracts totaling \$108,500 to support the first program that will begin in August 2007. Payment for these contracts is due prior to the commencement of the program and will be recorded as program services revenue.
