Anam Pakistan





Henry (Nigeria) has four years of experience in the nonprofit sector. He earned a Bachelor's degree in Meteorology from the Federal University of Technology, Nigeria, and a Certificate in Project Management (PM). Working as a Corps Liaison Officer with National Youth Service (NYSC) in Central Nigeria, Henry led 200 corps-members to raise funds to execute Community Empowerment projects, which impacted over 5,000 rural-dwellers. Likewise, he initiated "Space-Clubs" as extra-curricular activities in underserved-schools and constructed Amateur-Telescopes which inspired students to dream big. He was awarded the "NYSC-State Coordinator's Award of Excellence & Diligence." In 2016, Henry was named Top-25 Innovator at the General Electric (GE) Lagos Garage-Incubator.

He co-founded ASTIOtech, a tech-based social enterprise that leverages on 3D-Printing & local materials to manufacture "IrawoScope" - Africa's first 3D-printed affordable telescopes aimed at making STEM learning more exciting and engaging for African youths. AstioTech was selected (as the only African startup) into the inaugural cohort of Innovators in the world's first Space Digital-Accelerator. Furthermore, as a Fellow of the prestigious Carrington Youth Fellowship Initiative Henry leads Project SkillUP, aimed to train 300 students in urban slums of Lagos with digital literacy skills and internships to thrive in the 21st-century workplace. Fascinated with space, he currently volunteers as an Analogue Astronaut and Membership Manager in the Executive Committee of Space Generation Advisory Council (SGAC), a nonprofit youth-led organization of the UN, and was awarded the "2016 SGAC Leadership Award" for promoting STEM education in Africa.

Vivek has four years of experience in the nonprofit sector. He earned a Bachelor's degree in Civil Engineering from Gujarat Power Engineering and Research Institute, and a Diploma in Project Management from Alison Online University. The Innovation Council of Gujarat Technological University granted him a fellowship for his research on Solid Waste Management. He designed a bioreactor chamber of flexible high strength polymer material that's easily available and affordable for developing countries. Under his leadership at Olam International Limited in Mouila, Gabon, the company built over seven hundred houses for plantation workers, installed sixty-five hand pumps, bore wells, and more than a thousand solar street lights in rural villages of Africa. Vivek completed Climate Reality Project training under the former Vice President of the U.S. Al Gore in Miami, U.S. He delivered seven presentations in Asia, Europe, North America, and Africa spreading awareness about climate change. He initiated a movement to preserve the Heritage Structures of Siddhpur in Gujarat, India. His efforts resulted in a 13% increase in tourism and a 60% decrease in the demolition of heritage buildings in Siddhpur. The Government of Gujarat honored him for his contribution.
