CHIBUZOR (NIGERIA)

Chibuzor is a monitoring, evaluation, accountability and learning professional, with over five years of work experience in emergency and development contexts in Nigeria and holds a Bachelor's degree in Health Education from University of Nigeria, Nsukka. She currently works as a Monitoring and Evaluation Officer at the International Rescue Committee, where she conducts overall project monitoring, M&E system design and implementation, development of indicator trackers, and dissemination of findings and best practices. Prior to now, Chibuzor worked as a Monitoring, Evaluation, and Reporting Consultant in the Strengthening Integrated Delivery of HIV/AIDS Services. In this capacity, she conducted data quality reviews using both qualitative and quantitative methods of data collection, analyzed findings, and produced reports using Adobe InDesign. Chibuzor led the design and coordination of M&E tracking tools, output, and outcome indicators. She designed training and communication materials, tailored to improve the capacity of both beneficiaries and project staff. While working as a case Manager with Achieving Health Initiative Nigeria, under PEPFAR funded HIV/AIDS/TB project, she worked to ensure persons who test HIV positive are properly counselled and placed on antiretroviral therapy and facilitated safe space sessions for GBV survivors. Working in these capacities has strengthened her monitoring and evaluation skills to be applicable across different areas. Chibuzor interests herself with inclusion using M&E systems and is focused on Women's Protection and Empowerment.
