EMMANUEL (RWANDA)

Emmanuel is a sustainable energy consultant and co-founder and Executive Director of WE DO GREEN - one of Africa's rising and a Kigali-based certified youth-led environmental NGO. The team is on a mission to engage young people in responding to the climate crisis, leaving no one behind in the work for environmental protection and climate change mitigation. As Executive Director, Emmanuel coordinates the organization's activities, tackling issues of environmental sustainability, access to renewable energy, clean water, and food security with underprivileged communities around Rwanda. Emmanuel has an impressive track record in research, design, and project management, focusing on sustainable engineering solutions. After earning his bachelor's degree in Mechanical and Energy Engineering at the University of Rwanda, Emmanuel worked as an Energy Consultant at the Global Green Growth Institute (GGGI). Based in Seoul, GGGI is an intergovernmental organization supporting developing countries and emerging economies to achieve sustainable, inclusive growth. His policy research in Rwanda, Indonesia, and Mexico addressed how the inclusive transition toward green growth can have positive spillover effects, including gender mainstreaming, climate change mitigation, and community adaptation. His results and recommendations were published in a 2020 report on "Employment Assessment of Renewable Energy: Power sector pathways compatible with NDCs and national energy plans". Emmanuel has also worked as an energy engineer with Ahi Contractors where he carried out in-depth research on biogas technology in Rwanda and India, successfully developing a proof of concept approved by the Rwandan government in 2018.



MARIAM (JORDAN)

Mariam (Jordan) has four years of experience in international nonprofit organisations. She obtained her bachelor degree in English Language and Literature from the Faculty of Educational Arts and Sciences/UNRWA in Jordan. In April 2019, she joined the Centre for Victims of Torture as MENA Trainer in New Tactics in Human Rights program/ Center for Victims of Torture. As a trainer in the human rights field, she works on multiple international programs devoted to helping human rights defenders globally to improve their advocacy, resilience, and security. She also trains human rights activists to plan and implement their advocacy campaigns based on a clear methodology that adopts the human rights approach. Prior to this, she worked at IMPACT and REACH initiatives for studies and assessments. Through her experience as a project officer, she has developed many skills in project management, data collection, data analysis, monitoring and evaluation, and writing reports. Mariam has strong cross-cultural communication skills and has shown a strong flexibility to work with a team of different backgrounds. While working with human rights defenders, refugees, and the most vulnerable communities, an interest has developed within her to make more efforts towards these groups to make this world a better place for them.
